Analysis of the territory from an economical point of view.


The city of Kavala began to become an urban center in the 1920s, when its population grew rapidly, due to the large number of refugees after the Asia Minor Catastrophe who came and settled in the city. The increase of the population led from a very early age to the development of the industrial sector. The majority of the city's inhabitants, 77% [32], are employed in the tertiary production sector.

The development of trade made it necessary to build a new port in the industrial area of the city. The construction works of the new port of Kavala "Filippos B" started in 1990 and the western quay has already been completed. Since October 2002, all the mechanical equipment has been transferred and the commercial traffic is now served by it. The new port replaces the main port of Kavala and is located a few meters from the factory branch of BFL Kavala.



Finally, Kavala is known for its fishing, with the primary sector as a whole accounting for 10% of the city's economy. Overfishing and non-feeding of fish is considered a big problem. In fact, a decision was announced to ban fishing within the city port. The city has one of the largest fish markets in the Mediterranean, from where goods move in both domestic and international markets. The development of fisheries has made it imperative to establish in Kavala, one of the three Fisheries Research Institutes (INALE) that operate today in Greece.

Grape production is one of the main pillars of the local economy and exports of our region and as well as other products such as olives and almonds

Almond cultivation in the Prefecture of Kavala is located in an area of 17,389.7 acres, almonds are also sent throughout Greece and in some areas abroad.
